#### A. About The Confirmation Program

We are so excited to accompany parish youth as they prepare to encounter Christ in the sacrament of Confirmation! Our team, here at the Good Shepherd Catholic Parish, are so proud of every candidate that takes this step to grow in relationship with Our Lord. Our team of volunteers are here to support our youth as they grow in spirituality and learn about the richness of our Church.

Confirmation II is part of the two-year confirmation program. Candidates are required to complete two years of Confirmation preparation before receiving the sacrament in **spring 2024**.

#### C. Program Topics

Our Confirmation program follows the **Chosen** program by **Ascension Press**.  
Topics Covered in Confirmation II include:

1. Lesson 13- "What does the Holy Spirit do for me? (Gifts for the Journey)
2. Lesson 14 "Why have I been Chosen?" (Sealed and Sent in Confirmation)
3. Lesson 15- "Why do I have to go to Mass?" (Encountering Jesus in the Eucharist)
4. Lesson 16- "What does it mean to say, I do?" (Marriage, a Sign of God's Love)
5. Lesson 17- "Who's Calling?" (Holy Orders and Vocational Discernment)
6. Lesson 18- "Are you talking to me?" (Getting to Know God through Prayer)

7. Lesson 19- “Who is Mary?” (Meeting the Mother of God-and Your Heavenly Family)
8. Lesson 20- “What would Jesus do?” (The Beatitudes as a Path to True Happiness)
9. Lesson 21- “Do I have what it takes?” (Building Virtue- Your Spiritual Workout)
10. Lesson 22- “Why wait?” (God’s Plan for Love and Sex)
11. Lesson 23- “How do I build the kingdom?” (Saying “Yes to the Mission of Christ and His Church)
12. Lesson 24- “Where do I go from here?” (The Journey Continues)

#### **D. Text & Required Supplies**

1. Required Text: *Chosen: Your Journey Toward Confirmation* published by Ascension Press
2. Students are provided with a backpack containing all supplies necessary for class. Students must bring their backpack to class each week.

#### **E. Program Requirements**

Major Requirements to successfully complete Confirmation II and receive Confirmation are as follows:

1. Attendance
2. Participation
3. Retreats
4. Community Service

#### **Attendance:**

Class begins at 5:00pm and ends at 7:00pm.

Students are allowed 2 absences per semester. Any additional absences will result in a meeting with Student, Parents, and Director as well as possible postponement of Sacrament. Candidates are responsible for retrieving any late work, makeup work, or important information from the catechist if absent.

Students will be marked as tardy if they arrive after 5:10pm or leave before 7:50pm. Two tardies will count as one absence.

#### **Participation:**

Students are expected to contribute to group discussion and share insights into the topics at hand.

Confirmation class is a no phone zone. Phones are to remain away for the duration of class unless needed in an emergency.

Students are expected to come to class with all necessary materials each week.

Mass is incorporated into the class time. Attending mass is required for students as part of the class regardless of whether students have previously attended mass that day. If students have already received their first communion, they need to go to confession regularly to be in a state of grace to receive communion each week.

Students will have a reflection assignment at the completion of each chapter. Students are responsible for completing all assigned reflections & projects throughout the year. This includes selecting an eligible person to be a sponsor and researching to find a saint to take for confirmation.

### **Retreats:**

Confirmation 2 will have a retreat in October. Participation is mandatory and necessary as part of their formation. On separate weekends boys and girls in year 2 will go on a three-day retreat held at scicon. Over these weekends we hope to lead student to personal encounter with Christ through prayer, reflection & fellowship. While we understand that not every family can afford the additional expense, we encourage every family to see this opportunity as an investment in their child's faith formation. Keep in mind that we will offer flexible payment options and we DO NOT want any student to miss out on this opportunity due to financial reasons. Boys Retreat: October 13<sup>th</sup> -15<sup>th</sup>

Girls Retreat: October 20<sup>th</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup>

### **Community Service:**

Each small group is responsible for organizing a community service project to participate in as a group with their catechist. All activities must be submitted to the Director for approval 1-2 weeks in advance.

## G. Behavioral Expectations

- **Code of Conduct**

- Students must politely obey the requests and directions of the adult leaders.
- Students must stay with their assigned group at all times.
- Students must participate in the approved activities at all times.
- Students must dress appropriately at all times.
- Students must be on time to activities and will observe all check-in rules.
- Students must come to class prepared.
- Students must treat others with respect and will not engage in behavior that reflects poorly on themselves or the group which includes, but not limited to stealing, swearing, fighting, being physically or verbally abusive, being dishonest, damaging property, threatening others, or engaging in disruptive behavior.
- Students must not participate in hazing, teasing, bullying, or similar activities.
- Students must not engage in any illegal activities including, but not limited to smoking, using drugs, gambling, possession of tobacco, drugs, or any weapons.

As candidates for confirmation, students must take responsibility for their actions. Students will be sent home if they do not comply with this Code of Conduct to the satisfaction of the adult leaders.

- **Dress code**

Although the Catholic Church has no official dress code for proper attire when attending Mass, there IS an unwritten dress code that demands we are properly dressed out of respect, honor, and reverence for the Real Presence of Our Lord.

When you dress for Mass, you are not dressing to impress others, you are dressing for God. There are TWO main reasons one should dress modestly and decently for Mass:

- Out of respect and reverence for God
- In order not to be a distraction or stumbling block to our fellow parishioners

Some insight Catechism of the Catholic Church in regard to dressing properly for Mass:

To prepare for worthy reception of this sacrament, the faithful should observe the fast required in their Church. Bodily demeanor (gestures, clothing) ought to convey the respect, solemnity, and joy of this moment when Christ becomes our guest – CCC 1387

Generally, we should be guided by a combination of virtue, common sense and piety when deciding what to wear to Mass. Below are some guidelines to follow when deciding how to dress for Mass.

- Do Not Wear The Following:
  - Any dress or skirt that does not completely cover the knees when sitting or standing
  - shorts of any kind
  - Tank tops of any kind
  - Dresses and tops that are tight-fitting, provocative, low-cut, bare midriff or sleeveless.
  - Clothing that is excessively baggy
  - Dresses or tops with spaghetti straps, with plunging necklines, that expose the bare shoulders or bare-back, or that are see-through
  - Dresses or skirts with high slits
  - Jeans with rips or tears
  - Leggings
  - T-shirts
  - Pajamas
  - Sweatshirts or sweatpants
  - Any outfits with large logos or distracting messages
  - Flip flops, sneakers or beach sandals
- Do wear:
  - Modest tops, dresses or skirts.
  - Dress pants or Dark wash Jeans
  - Dress Shirts or Polos
  - Chapel veils (optional) – covering of the hair for women in the presence of the Eucharist is done out of respect for Our Lord.
